The MAN Group is one of Europe's leading commercial vehicle, engine and mechanical engineering companies. MAN's business activities are grouped into the business areas Commercial Vehicles, comprising MAN Truck & Bus and MAN Latin America, and Power Engineering, featuring MAN Diesel & Turbo and Renk. With over 53,000 employees, the Group operates in more than 180 countries. MAN looks back on more than 250 years of corporate history and generated sales revenue of €13.6 billion in the reporting year 2016.

The MAN Group focuses on activities in the areas of transport and energy and develops innovative products which ensure efficiency and sustainability. The company supplies trucks, buses, diesel engines, turbomachinery and special gear units and holds leading market positions in all divisions.

MAN aims at profitable global growth and sustainable increase in the company value. Customer orientation, technology leadership, and the ongoing expansion of after-sales services are considered crucial in achieving these goals.

## Requirements

In 2011, the internet authority ICANN approved the plan to increase the pool of available domain name endings and allowed the introduction of numerous new generic top-level domains (gTLDs). In addition to traditional TLDs like ».de« or ».com«, new domain endings specific for cities or industries became possible, such as ».nyc« or ».shop«, for example.

More importantly, this extension of the domain namespace made it possible for trademark owners to bring their own brand TLD into life. This allows to actively protect a trademark on the Internet, to develop new marketing strategies and to benefit from new forms of quality control on the Internet.

The MAN Group immediately recognized the potential of owning their own generic TLD. The company thus looked for a partner to support them in applying for the top-level domain ».man« at ICANN as well as to take care of the TLD's technical operation.

Manfred Schurer, Head of E-Communications, explains why the MAN Group chose Knipp as their partner: »We have known Knipp for many years as an Internet provider and software house.
